
The Lighting of the Advent Candle

### A Note from our Accessible to All (A2A) Team

We are publishing a series of articles about accessibility and how those dear to us have been impacted by our spaces. We are grateful to Judy Furman for sharing Peg Atkinson's story.

Peg and Dick Atkinson and my husband Chuck and I met when we were all newcomers at Grand Valley State College (then) University (now). One summer, as Peg and Dick were driving home from a week spent volunteering at the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation in South Dakota, the car left the road and rolled over. The result was a spinal cord injury which left Peg paralyzed from the neck down. Five months of therapy at Mary Free Bed Hospital helped Peg regain the use of her right hand – she had always been left handed – so she could drive a power wheelchair.

For several years Peg had been an active, contributing member of the bell choir but was now unable to grasp the handles of the bells, or lift the heavy ones, in order to play them. The choir purchased a rack which looks like a cross between an old coat tree and a Charlie Brown Christmas Tree. By hanging bells on the "arms" of the rack and providing Peg a thick-handled mallet, she was able to strike the bells and continue to play in the ensemble. Being able to take part in Park's worship experience was wonderful for her. Although she continued to be wheelchair bound, the choir's move toward accessibility meant that they, too, retained a talented and valuable member.

The Park Church Christmas Offering takes place every December and benefits one or more organizations selected by the Board of Deacons. You can make your donation by cash or check using the designated envelope in the bulletin or by using the QR code in the bulletin.

#### **Dear Park Church Family and Friends**

We are thrilled to name Undue Medical Debt (http://unduemedicaldebt.org) as our 2025 Christmas Offering recipient. Undue Medical Debt is the leading 501(c)3 non-profit working to eliminate the medical debt of neighbors in our country. They have worked closely with many congregations in the United Church of Christ, including the congregation Pastor Darryl discussed in his "Forgive Us Our Debts" sermon during the Lord's Prayer series this summer.

As of 2023, seven in ten adults in the United States say they received a medical bill they cannot afford. In Michigan alone, over 1.3 million households have medical debts in collections. The most likely cause of the debt is the inability to cover the cost of an unexpected medical event or accident. This happens to insured and uninsured people alike, though those living near or below the poverty line, single parent families, and people of color are disproportionately impacted. Carrying medical debt can have severe lasting consequences causing stress, anxiety, depression, straining relationships, garnished wages, and delaying other needed medical care.

By partnering with Undue Medical Debt, we hope to offer some of our neighbors a tremendous gift of love, joy, and peace through our Christmas Offering.

- For every \$1 donated, \$100 in medical debt will be erased. This is because Un due Medical Debt purchases the debt in large, bundled portfolios at pennies on the dollar.
- Our goal is \$15,000 so that we can eliminate \$1,500,000 in debt for our neighbors.
- We have asked Undue Medical Debt to allocate the money raised in our Christmas Offering to assist folks living with debt in West Michigan, prioritizing Kent, Ottawa, Ionia, and Muskegon Counties.
- The process is income-based. Undue Medical Debt uses data analytics to pinpoint the debts of those experiencing financial hardship. Relief cannot be requested, and recipients don't have to apply — they're simply notified of debt abolishment.

Like getting an unexpected gift from St. Nicholas himself, our neighbors in West Michigan get surprise letters that their debt has been erased! There is no application, tax consequences or penalties. Their debts are just gone, and the relief is joyous. We will hear testimonials throughout Advent about the deep and lasting impact this relief has had on people's lives, and we will be joined by a member of Undue Medical Debt's philanthropy team on Sunday, December 15. You are encouraged to support the 2024 Christmas Offering. Thank you for your tremendous generosity and care for our neighbors.
