If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions and if I hand over my body so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part, but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see only a reflection, as in a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. A Note from our Accessible to All (A2A) Team

I humbly serve as Vice Moderator of Park Church and am a passionate member of the A2A team. I am also someone who lives with a hearing disability. There are more than a few of us at Park Church. Several people have commented over the last couple of years about having difficulty hearing everything from the front of the church. Changes have been made to the microphones on the pulpit and lectern, and our audio team in the church have worked hard to address this problem. We also have "Hearing Assistance Devices" available for people to use every Sunday. Please see an usher if you need one. Despite these efforts, some people are still having difficulties.

One thing I recently learned is that the church has additional support for people who wear hearing aids. Bluetooth software has been installed so that people with hearing aids can connect directly to the sound system for clearer reception of what is happening. For me, this has added levels of clarity and richness to the service. Unfortunately, not all hearing aids are compatible. But I encourage you to check. You need only to speak with an usher before the service. Or you can call the church office for more information. A2A is working to make Park Church more accessible. It is heartening to know that we already have a spirit of A2A though much more needs to be done.
